PRESENTATION TO BASSETLAW FASHION SERVICES

At a recent presentation evening, Retford Lions were able to make donations totalling £8500. In keeping with the club's commitment to youth activities, many of the beneficiaries were youth groups in the area.

Three Scout groups and St John Cadets, all of whom provide assistance with Santa's visits in the area, shared £475. Retford Gymnastics Club, which provides opportunities for over 300 people, received a cheque for £500 towards the cost of a new safety mat and Thrumpton School a donation of £500 towards the cost of equipping a sensory room for pupils with specific needs.

Additionally, as a result of the recent appeal to clubs in the District, we were able to present a cheque for £1525 to Bassetlaw Fashion Services. The Retford Club would like to offer their sincere thanks to the 12 clubs that contributed to this very worthwhile and almost unique charity.

The largest donation of the evening was reserved for the Bassetlaw Hospital. The club has for some time been involved in trying to raise awareness of Prostate Cancer. Last year a portable blood testing device was purchased for the department and the club heard of the need for a TRUS machine at the hospital; this piece of equipment will mean that many gents from the area will not have to travel to Doncaster for elements of their treatment.

The club benefitted from a legacy made by a local gentleman a while ago and was looking for a suitable project. This was deemed to be that project and a donation of £5500 was made towards the cost of the £55000 piece of equipment.

The weather that day was fine and dry but the pitch was a bit 'claggy' from previous rain. The small Club building provided basic facilities, but the hospitality of the hosts was excellent with free refreshments throughout. Louth Old Boys turned out in blue and Whetstone in red with a modest number of supporters coaxing each team.

The match kicked off just before 12.30pm and after initial settling Whetstone began to show their skill. Goals flowed fairly steadily making the score at half time 7 – 0. The second half must have looked a bit daunting for Louth, but they came out and bravely gave their best. The far superior Whetstone lads just kept going and racked up another 6 goals making the final score:

The Louth keeper should be commended – he might have let 13 in but he probably saved just as many.

A National Tournament is bound to draw in a range, in terms of quality, of teams and this match did exemplify that. It was pleasing to see the Louth manager take the trouble to address the Whetstone team after the match and congratulate and wish them well. One sided it might have been, but a very 'sporting' atmosphere throughout.

After the match, the small building revealed a small army of helpers who proceeded to provide a quantity and selection of food for all not previously seen before – a splendid effort and contribution by the host parents.

Whetstone now play hosts to Healing Hotspurs sponsored by Grimsby NE Lincs in round 3.

NEWS UPDATE FROM THE DISTRICT LCIF COORDINATOR

LCIF Shining a Beacon of Hope

Many Lions will wish to be updated on the role our organisation is playing in what seems like an endless stream of disasters Worldwide. It is important to stress that Lions are not an aid agency with the resources and skills to fly in and start high profile activities from “day one”.

Lions do however have the almost unique advantage of having Clubs and influential Lion’s members already on the ground in the affected countries. These Lions have a real understanding of the needs of the affected communities and the local knowledge that allows the money collected from Lions Club members around the World to be used effectively. Too often when disasters occur the aid agencies descend with massive resources to save lives and get essential services restarted but then out of necessity have to move on. Hopefully Lions money will still be there working long after the disaster has left the headlines.

LCIF has opened an appeal for the Australian Flood Disaster, Clubs wishing to make a donation should send cheques to the District Treasurer clearly indicating this on the back of the cheque.

However, there is a dilemma, Clubs should seriously consider making undesignated donations as the Foundation relies on these funds to make Grants for all its activities including disaster relief.

The latest news about Haiti is that LCIF have signed off a project to rebuild the National Nurses School of Port Au Prince, LCIF will provide \$368,421 US Dollars or 27% of the entire cost of construction and equipment. Other projects for LCIF Funding are still in the development stage including suitable educational and medical projects for the donations which are now in excess \$660,000 dollars provided by the Lions Clubs of the British Isles and Ireland.

The total amount of money donated by District E for Pakistan is £10367.27 and for Haiti is £1153.90 and the combined amount of money for Pakistan donated by the Clubs of MD105 for this Fiscal year is £162,371.77 and for Haiti is £12501.92.

The total amount of undesignated donations is £1500.00.

LCIF have now introduced a Contributing Members Programme and provided me with the necessary pins, the cost is \$20 US Dollars per member (£13.00), both the District Governor and the Vice Governors also have a small supply.

Congratulations to the 3 100% Contributing Members Clubs who will now receive a banner patch and also to the individuals who have become Contributing Members.

I encourage all Clubs to become 100 percent Contributing Members Clubs which can be paid out of their Charity Accounts, as this is an excellent of Clubs supporting LCIF.

RETENTION MATTERS!

Fellow Lions – There’s only a short time left for us to work on retaining the members we will otherwise lose before the next club subscriptions are due.

We all know the process; we review the membership list and drop those that haven’t been active or haven’t paid their dues, just before the June deadline!

Perhaps this year your club might change that process. Start now, get in touch with any members who haven’t been seen recently; are they ill? do they have new family commitments? do they feel undervalued? With sensitive discussion, a work-around can be found for many situations and the club member will feel valued and want to remain in your club.

More difficult is the, soon to be a big problem, question of finance. It is probable that some members have already begun to feel the pressure of rising prices; is your club able to, in confidence, support members who are facing hard times? How about raising the topic at your next club meeting?

DREAM MAKING FOR SICK CHILDREN

On 9th February 2011, The Vale of Belvoir Lions had Maggie Falconer of When You Wish Upon A Star attending as a guest speaker. The charity has an office in Nottingham, in the futurist house on Valley Road, and also has a further two offices in Stockport and Grimsby.

Set up some 21 years ago, its primary aim is grant wishes to children with life threatening or terminal illnesses. A very worthy cause indeed. Children aged between 2 and 16 can ask literally for any wish they want to come true.

Over 14,000 wishes have been granted since starting, and every year, every single wish asked for is granted! A remarkable feat for a charity.



Typical wishes include, meeting a favorite sporting hero, a laptop so children in hospital can keep in touch and use the internet, meeting a pop band or singer, toys to play with and the most popular of all a trip to Florida to meet Mickey Mouse and other Disney characters. In fact one little boy's wish was to take part in the parade at Disneyland....When You Wish Upon A Star made this come true.

This year, the charity is raising funds to send 400 sick or ill children to Lapland to see Santa and his magical kingdom. A total of 100 children per flight, each with a guardian aim to be flown to Lapland later this year. Each flight costs £70,000, so the cost of sending a single child is £700.00 per seat.



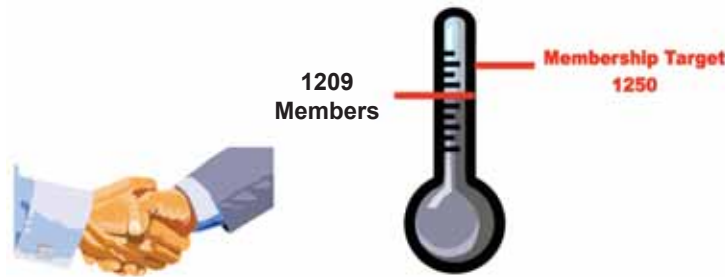
